A minimum of 2.25 in a major related to the life sciences at the baccalaureate level. Bachelor of Science in chemical or analytical chemistry, pharmacology, toxicology, biochemistry, molecular biology, or a related field with a grade point average of at least 2. Biochemistry and molecular biology majors must show proof of taking at least one chemistry class.

The salary range for Forensic Medicine in the UK

In the United Kingdom, the average gross salary for a forensic medical examiner is £167,159 per year, or £80 per hour in England. This is £13,674 less than the typical salary for a forensic medical examiner in the UK. They also receive an average bonus of £11,333 per year. Estimated wages are based on what employers and workers in England said about their pay in an anonymous salary survey. The average annual income of a forensic medical examiner with no more than three years of experience is £111,215. On the other end of the spectrum is the average compensation of a senior-level forensic medical examiner (8+ years of experience), which is £221,920.
